



Fluffy 'Invaders': The Unexpected Ecological Disaster Brought by Rabbits in Australia


Dilara Turan's notes provide a commentary and summary of the tragic story of rabbits in Australia, written in response to a short documentary and a brief exploration of the topic.

Civilised by beasts: Animals and Urban Change in Nineteenth-Century Dublin



Pet Revolution: Animals and the Making of Modern British Life


